

TRAINING REQUIREMENT
Cold-Climate ASHP Sizing and Design

Dear ASHP manufacturers and stakeholders,

The NYS Clean Heat Program would like to remind air source heat pump (ASHP) manufacturers and stakeholders that beginning January 1, 2022, all ASHP installers seeking to enroll as NYS Clean Heat participating contractors **must complete an ASHP manufacturer-sponsored cold-climate ASHP sizing and design training.**

Currently NYS Clean Heat participating contractors installing ASHPs are required to complete an ASHP manufacturer-sponsored installation training. Beginning January 1, 2022, new ASHP installers seeking to enroll must also provide documentation that they've completed the new ASHP manufacturer-sponsored cold-climate ASHP sizing and design training requirement.

A [course curriculum guide](#) and [training presentation content](#), developed by NYSERDA, was introduced to the ASHP manufacturers in April. As a reminder, it is strongly encouraged for each ASHP manufacturer to develop and deliver a course based on a developed training design guide, or incorporate an available manufacturer-agnostic training into their trainings by January 1, 2022.

Details of this enrollment requirement are identified in **Section 4. Participating in the Program** in the current [NYS Clean Heat Program Manual](#) as well as under the "For Manufacturers" tab on the [NYS Clean Heat program resources](#) webpage.

The New York State Clean Heat program strongly urges all participating contractors, even those already in the program, to take advantage of this training opportunity. Heat pump sizing, design, and product selection in cold climates is a nuanced, learned skill. These trainings were developed with the goal of better installation outcomes leading to fewer call backs for ASHP installers.
